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5. Cornwall Gardens Trust

The CGT is dedicated to raising awareness of the county's garden heritage and to conserve and foster it for the benefit of present and future generations. One of the aims of the Trust is to promote and help maintain school gardening schemes. We can:-

- provide funding up to £300.00 per project to assist schools in the setting up and maintenance of gardening projects
- provide guidance on how to set up projects
- act as a link between existing projects

- 7. 300 children in the County have signed up to the All Stars Cricket programme so far, with capacity for more children to take part. All Stars Cricket is an 8 week structured programme of fundamental game related cricket skills for 5-8 year olds. Run by local cricket Centres, Cornwall has 29 across the County. All Centres are quality assured, with fully trained Activators who hold DBS vetting checks, Safeguarding and First Aid qualifications. Cost is £40 per person, but this covers the 8 week training programme and each registration gets a bag of personalised kit, including a Bat, ball, bag, t-shirt, water bottle and a hat.
