- 1. We hope that your half term was excellent in spite of some interesting weather. Now back for a very short run to Easter with lots to cram in. A key to that will, of course, be the International Egg Rolling Competition preparations in all establishments!
- 2. **Ofsted**. We were in discussion with an Ofsted lead inspector yesterday and they referred to the deep dives for reading. If you are expecting a visit we would direct you to the back of the Guidelines and to the seven bullet points under Early Reading (part 3, p87). They will give you all you need to consider. The other key issue is that all books need to be decodable to demonstrate the effectiveness of phonics teaching.
- 3. Further on Ofsted, Sean Harford published a blog recently on <u>extending the transition curriculum transition arrangements</u> for a further year; and NAHT has <u>published their emerging findings</u> on the new inspection framework.
- 4. Operation Encompass will be holding a Briefing probably in May, however, they now have Key Adult training online accessible through the <u>Operation Encompass website</u>. The training is free and has been created with the support of the Home Office. This online training is available for ALL school staff, not just Key Adults.
- 5. You should all have received a 'Save the Date' email from Healthy Schools about the Health and Well-being Conference on 7<sup>th</sup> July. A key part of the day will be a focus on the PSHE curriculum launch. This will make it important for all schools. They aim to have the follow up information about the event out to schools by mid-March.
