

Babies

EYFS01 Improving provision for babies

Aimed at: Age range 0 to 18 months. Baby and toddler room staff, childminders, foster

carers.

This half day session will focus upon improving provision for babies under eighteen months old at day nurseries, childminders and foster carers. The course will encourage the development of partnerships with parents and carers and will emphasise the importance of the key person approach. We will share recent research about babies' brain development and consider the implications for our daily practice.

The course aims to:

- support practitioners to maximise the learning potential of daily routines such as nappy changing and meal times;
- increase practitioners' knowledge of the development of a baby's brain;
- enhance partnerships with parents and carers to promote emotional wellbeing;
- offer ideas about how to provide nurturing environments for babies in the setting and in the home learning environment.

Babies

EYFS02 Baby hubs

Developing good and outstanding practice in baby rooms and childminding settings

Aimed at: Age range 0 to 18 months. Baby room staff, childminders.

This two hour networking session will introduce up to date research about babies' learning and development to improve practice when working with very young children. National research has shown that baby room practitioners often have less opportunity than other practitioners to attend training in order to develop excellent practice for babies (The Baby Room Project, Canterbury Christchurch University 2015 https://tactyc.org.uk/pdfs/Reflection-Goouch.pdf). In Cornwall we hope to address this by developing local networks for baby room practitioners so they have the opportunity to share good practice, discuss the challenges they face and provide each other with ideas for improvement. In turn this will develop practitioner confidence and knowledge ensuring high quality provision for babies.

During the sessions there will be time to build professional links with other local baby room practitioners to continue to share ideas and practice in the future. We will discuss ideas for developing an enabling, stimulating environment for babies in the indoor and outdoor environment.

The networking session aims to:

- discuss up to date research about baby room practice;
- support professional links between local practitioners and develop support networks;
- improve practice in baby rooms and outdoor areas for young children and therefore improve outcomes for children.

Advice and guidance

Aimed at: Those interested in becoming an Ofsted registered childminder.

If you are thinking of becoming a childminder you need to consider the implications of becoming self-employed and working from your own home. You should weigh up the drawbacks and benefits, the effect it will have on your home and family members and the cost of setting up your new business. We also advise that you look at the Family Information Service website www.supportincornwall.org.uk to find out what the current provision is in your area and whether there may be a demand for your services.

EYFS03 Childminders Count – new online training course!

Aimed at: Childminders, childminder assistants and anyone who is looking to become a

registered childminder.

This online training opportunity is available for new and existing childminders. It supports the development of 66 Learning Outcomes through three hours of film plus practical tasks, handouts and internet links. You can view a trailer at https://vimeo.com/133460306

Childminders Count develops the professional aspects of childminding including business, startup and marketing elements and setting standards. It examines what poor childminding looks like and the consequences, contrasting it with what good quality childminding looks like and the benefits of high quality provision.

The course has three modules and would be ideal for anyone who has already completed Early Years Foundation Stage training or has experience of working in a setting.

Existing childminders will find the materials useful as a way to review and improve their practice; we will use some of them as a basis for discussion at the Quality Childminding in Cornwall network meetings.

Quality Childminding in Cornwall programme

Aimed at: Childminders, childminder assistants and those looking to become a registered

childminder.

Are you a registered childminder in Cornwall? Would you like a local childminder mentor to answer your queries, keep you up to date with news and create opportunities for you to meet up with other childminders?

If so then in addition to the support from the childminding specialist early years support assistant and Family Information Service (FIS), you can join the Quality Childminding in Cornwall (QCC) programme. The QCC programme aims to promote quality and develop the provision of 30 hours funded care in the county.

We will link you to one of our six locality mentors, each an experienced practising childminder.

Members receive a discount on training courses in the Cornwall Council Education and Early Years training directory, a termly newsletter and access to a closed Facebook page. We have regular evening network meetings across the county and this year we have planned activity mornings in the autumn and spring terms with the annual summer meet up again in July.

There is no charge to join but as part of our aim to promote quality we ask you to complete the SEND Local Offer information on your FIS profile and to complete a minimum of 20 hours continuing professional development each year.

You will gain ideas on how to develop children's independence, self-esteem, imagination and communication and language skills through the way in which you organise your setting's environment and the content of your continuous provision.

CLO34 National water safety management programme Level 1 and level 2 beach

The national Water Safety Management Programme is a suite of interlinked training awards, specifically designed to assist those organisations with employees who work in, or near water to meet their civil and statutory safety management obligations.

The awards in this programme bridge the gap between no qualification and full lifeguard. It is not an award that will replace the lifeguard award but is an excellent way in which competency in and around water may be demonstrated. This programme is progressive so everyone starts with the foundation Basic Water Safety Awareness award (a self-study unit followed by a half day guided Learning Unit) and may move into a range of environment specific awards (including River, Still Water and Beach) leading, where required, to In Water Rescue Award. This course will cover level 1 and level 2 beach. Level 2 river and Level 3 (in water rescue) is organised on demand.

Level 1: Basic Water Safety Awareness Module

• For those working or supervising near water who do not have a definite intention to get into the water, for example beach games.

Level 2: Environment Specific Modules (Beach)

• For those who have a greater likelihood of getting closer to or in the water but with definite intention to stay within standing depth, for example rock pooling.



CLO34 National water safety management programme – level 1 and level 2 beach

Aimed at: Any members of staff who take children and young people to areas where

there is water.

The national Water Safety Management Programme is a suite of interlinked training awards, specifically designed to assist those organisations with employees who work in, or near water to meet their civil and statutory safety management obligations.

The awards in this programme bridge the gap between no qualification and full lifeguard. It is not an award that will replace the lifeguard award but is an excellent way in which competency in and around water may be demonstrated. This programme is progressive so everyone starts with the foundation Basic Water Safety Awareness award (a self-study unit followed by a half day guided Learning Unit) and may move into a range of environment specific awards (including River, Still Water and Beach) leading, where required, to In Water Rescue Award. This course will cover level 1 and level 2 beach. Level 2 river and Level 3 (in water rescue) is organised on demand.

Level 1: Basic Water Safety Awareness Module

• For those working or supervising near water who do not have a definite intention to get into the water, for example beach games.

Level 2: Environment Specific Modules (Beach)

• For those who have a greater likelihood of getting closer to or in the water but with definite intention to stay within standing depth, for example rock pooling.
