Free resources on trauma-informed approaches

The delivery partners for our series of Trauma-Informed webinars, Sigma Teaching School Alliance, have just launched a new, free online resource focusing on trauma-informed approaches. The online course is a summary of the four cornerstones of a trauma-informed approach, intended to be able to be read in an hour, which provides a summary of the key messages from neuroscience and psychology regarding the practical actions that we can take to support children and young people at this extraordinary time. These can be used in conjunction with our recorded webinars to support ongoing learning and the embedding of trauma-informed approaches within daily practice.
