

## AWARDS FOR YOUNG WRITERS AND ARTISTS 2020- RULES AND GUIDANCE

- 1. Entry is open to young writers and artists from 4 to 16 years of age on 6.3.2020 who live in Cornwall & Isles of Scilly. All entries must be accompanied by an entry form which may be downloaded from the Festival website. Judging will take account of entrants' ages and Year Groups, any special needs and help given, which must be noted on the entry form. See below for Further Guidance for the Awards.
- 2. Deadline: All entries must be received on or before the deadline of 6th March 2020.
- 3. Subject: Entrants can create a poem, a story or a picture on the subject of 'The Spirit of Cornwall'
- 4. **Size:** Poems can be up to 20 lines and short stories can be up to 200 words. All written entries should be in English and may be word processed or handwritten clearly and legibly on A4 paper and can be sent by post, hand delivered, (see addresses below), or submitted online at www.foweyfestival.com.
  - Pictures should be **original**, **not** a copy, and on paper or card, no larger than A3, (420 x 594 mm or 16.5 x 23.4 in) but smaller pictures are also welcome and you can choose a different format: square or circle or panorama. Works of Art should be submitted by post or hand delivery only (not online).
- 5. **Acknowledgement:** If you require acknowledgement of receipt of a postal entry please enclose a stamped addressed postcard marked Fowey Festival Awards ACKNOWLEDGEMENT. Online entries will be acknowledged by email automatically. If you want your entry returned please enclose a SAE.
- 6. **Eligibility:** Entries must be entirely the work of the entrant (unless help with Special Needs are noted) and must never have been previously published, in print or online (including websites, blogs, social network sites), or broadcast or been commended, long-listed or short-listed in any competition. Any entry found to have been plagiarised will be disqualified.
- 7. **Judging:** Entries will be judged anonymously; the entrant's name and age should appear only on the entry form and on **the back** of the work of art or piece of writing. The pictures, poems and stories must be free of all personal information about the author, including their address.
- 8. **Shortlisted Entries** will be notified by 25th March 2020 and prizes will be presented at the Fowey Festival of Arts & Literature Awards Presentation Event in May 2020. If the winner cannot attend, prizes will be sent by post. Results will be published on <a href="https://www.foweyfestival.com">www.foweyfestival.com</a> by 9<sup>th</sup> April.

- 11. **Judges' Decision:** The Judges' decision is final and no individual correspondence will be entered into. The judges will not be able to give individual feedback on any entry.

## Young Artist and Writers Awards - Guidance for Young People, Teachers and Parents

The aim of the Young Artist and Writer of the Year Awards is to encourage young people to engage in visual arts and creative writing, to celebrate their creativity and originality. Each young artist and writer is invited to create a work of art or write on the theme of 'The Spirit of Cornwall'. They may choose to create either 'fine art' or a 'design', poetry or a short story.

Young artists and writers should be encouraged to be:

- Imaginative
- Experimental, Playful
- Visual
- Thoughtful

## For the Art

Any appropriate materials may be used and can be combined: collage and painting, or paint and crayon, ink and chalk for example; all work well together and can provide some unexpected outcomes.

The judges will be looking for young artists to demonstrate:

- Visually exciting, imaginative ideas
- Clever (skillful / imaginative / unusual) use of materials, tools and techniques
- Bold and effective presentation
- Unique personal engagement, individuality and creative potential.

Shortlisted pictures will be framed by Atishoo Gallery Charlestown and exhibited in Fowey River Gallery. Commended pictures will be selected for exhibit in Fowey Art Trail and Fowey Parish Church during the Fowey Festival.

Individual winners will be announced at an Awards Ceremony in Fowey Parish Church on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> May 2020. Judges may also award a prize to a school that demonstrates an outstanding commitment to art.

## For the Writing

The judges will be looking for young writers to demonstrate:

- · Exciting, imaginative ideas and creation of atmosphere
- Clever (skillful / imaginative / unusual) use of language
- Effective characterization
- Unique personal engagement, individuality and creative potential.

Shortlisted poems and stories and those commended by the judges will be exhibited in Fowey Parish Church and the shortlisted pieces of art will be exhibited in the Fowey River Gallery during the Fowey Festival. The winners will be announced at an Awards Ceremony in Fowey Parish Church on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> May 2020. The writers will have their poems and short stories read out at the Awards Ceremony.
