Child Sexual Abuse - Next Steps

At the OSCP Conference on Child Sexual Abuse on 24th September 2018, **Child Sexual Abuse – our strategy to help and protect children living in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly,** a multi-agency strategy to help and protect children and young people from sexual abuse within the family was launched.

Our Vision

Everyone living and working in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly recognizes the signs and symptoms of child sexual abuse.

- They are willing to think the unthinkable and have the strength and confidence to express their concerns without fear of the consequences.
- Children and young people have a good understanding of what represents a healthy relationship and recognize when they are being made to take part in sexual activity against their will.
- o Children and young people have the strength and confidence to tell someone they trust when they are uncomfortable or unhappy about what is happening to them.
- The people they tell listen to them, believe them and know what to do to stop it.

In September/October 2018, there was a Joint Targeted Area Inspection of the multi-agency response to sexual abuse in the family in Cornwall. The subsequent letter to the partnership acknowledged:

"There is a strong culture and commitment to partnership-working across the agencies in Cornwall that are involved in improving practice and services for children at risk of child sexual abuse in the family environment. There is a clear ambition to be innovative, to proactively learn and to provide better multiagency support and help for children who are at risk of child sexual abuse in the family environment and for children who display sexually harmful behaviour."
